The Board of Directors meeting was held on October 17, 2018 at 3:45 p.m.

Fall has arrived, and with it brings changes, including cooler temperatures and the arrival of snowbirds. I am sure that most snowbirds (like me) who have arrived in recent weeks are glad to have escaped to our SW Florida paradise before extremely cold weather hit up north. It is great to be back with our Florida friends and in the midst of our loving church family.

We have also seen changes in our congregational organization. Lee Page resigned as Chairperson of our Board of Directors; we thank Lee for his hard work and commitment to the congregation. As Vice Chair, I assumed those duties; at the October 17 meeting, the Board named me as Board Chairperson.

The Board is reviewing candidates to fill the Vice Chair position and plan to name that person at our November meeting. This will be a temporary appointment until the March congregational meeting. I am very grateful for all of the support and encouragement I've received during this transition. I promise to do my best to serve the Board and our entire congregation as we move forward on our life journeys.

As requested by the Social Action & Outreach Committee (SAOC), the board approved a modification to that committee's organization. The SAOC will be composed of the leaders, or their designees, of each of the four social action teams, and those representatives will elect their own chairperson.

The Board is evaluating ways to expand our parking.

Some additional spaces have been made on our lot to help offset the loss of spaces we had used on the property on Poinciana Ave. Susan Anthony also graciously offered several spaces on her property. Joe will work his magic in squeezing extra cars into our space while other parking options are being explored; stay tuned for further announcements.

The FUNraising Committee continues to plan fun events that are successfully bringing in the needed revenue to help us meet our budget. I heard that there was a fun horse race this past month put on by this talented group. Plan to attend the next big event, the annual dinner show, which is scheduled for January 19, 2019. Kendra Maroon and her crew will provide a delicious meal, and Joan Marshall is orga-

nizing the entertainment, a show titled "Salute to Singers." Alert: You must get your tickets as soon as they become available because these events sell out quickly. Another event approved by the Board is a possible performance by Acoustic Eidolon scheduled for February 15, 2019.

The board approved having a small group of college students from Georgia stay at All Faiths for a week in spring of 2019 while they conduct social justice activities in our community. More information will follow closer to their arrival. Supporting them demonstrates our commitment to social issues and our mission statement.

Sometimes we, as Unitarian Universalists, create some tension within ourselves: celebrating Thanksgiving and, at the same time, coming to terms with the historical reality of the relationship between refugee Puritans and Native Americans. Coming from Massachusetts I'm

especially affected by this tension. I've witnessed hundreds of Native Americans and their supporters gather at Plymouth Rock for a 'National Day of Mourning' protest. It is sobering to witness, and to relearn the Thanksgiving story as one of genocide and not one of a friendly potluck.

I used to be very defensive when I walked through the school hallways where my children were taught. Displays of pilgrims and Native Americans teaching children lies angered me. I've been known to educate a teacher or two. Today, however, I'm more tactful and understand how to honor the lives and legacy of Native Americans as well as to celebrate on the third Thursday of November.

We must bear witness to the truth and debunk the 'First. Thanksgiving' as a myth while reimagining the holiday. Mahtowin Munro, coleader of the United American Indians of New England, once said, "As indigenous people, we have been taught by our elders to give thanks every day. We are a people who survived genocide." She also said, "Indigenous people give thanks all the time. We are not against giving thanks, and we are not against people having meals

with their families. We are against the 'whitewashed' version of history."

So it is with this knowledge that I am comfortable with the Thanksgiving holiday. We must tell the story of Native Americans and we must call together those far and near to celebrate with gratitude. Richard and I will be celebrating with family and friends and feel grateful for our All Faiths family. We are truly blessed.

May your holiday be filled with truth, memory, gratitude and hope.



David Donovan Member Since May 2018



David Donovan was welcomed into membership at All Faiths in May of this year. He had attended an LGBTQ potluck and noticed our rainbow flag. Curious, he came back for a service and was impressed with CJ's sermon and the music. He says, "I was amazed at the community spirit and our willingness to apply for a grant to help a black community that was unrelated to All Faiths.

David was born 57 years ago in Connecticut and raised in Derry, New Hampshire, along with two younger brothers. He attended Catholic grade school and Pinkerton Catholic Academy, a large campus that accommodated both public and private students from the surrounding area.

David says he began to fall away from his Catholic upbringing when he moved away to attend college. Although he tried returning to Catholicism several times, he yearned for a younger, more giving religious community. He was especially dismayed by the millions of dollars that the Catholic church spent on fighting gay marriage.

David majored in plastic engineering, polymer science, at the University of Massachusetts at Lowell. While he was living on campus, his parents divorced and his mother moved to North Carolina. David came out as gay after college. Always his mother's favorite, he decided to visit her along with his partner. He called her and left a message, "I've got to talk to you about something." David says she panicked at first. "It took her a while but soon she's bragging about me!" Mother and son remained close and have vacationed together almost yearly. She currently lives with him in his Cape Coral home along with their golden retriever, Lourdes.

After graduating college, David began a 28-year career with Ford Motor Company. Although at first there were few protections for gays in the workplace, the United Auto Workers union won health insurance protection for gay partners. David moved to various Ford locations and worked as a design engineer, and then a resident engineer, i.e. problem solver, for

the assembly line. He later became a quality manager. David worked 18 years at the Ann Arbor plant. When the plant was sold to a French company his job was phased out.

David took advantage of this life change to explore a warmer climate. He first looked in Fort Lauderdale and decided it was too large and too transient feeling. He found the Gulf Coast side more to his liking and bought a home in Cape Coral in 2012.

The move was challenging as David was now without a job and had two mortgages. He found there were no opportunities for plastic engineers in the area. He worked for a short time for the Post Office before he was sidelined by gall bladder surgery.

David's current job as manager and trainer for Dollar General keeps him busy six days a week and limits his attending many All Faiths' activities. He attends services as often as possible. When asked about his personal goals for All Faiths, he would like to see more evening meetings and social gatherings. David reports that he is happy to have finally found a religious community that is passionate, meaningful, and relevant.



November 04 - This session highlights kindness and altruism in the web of life and encourages participants to act for the welfare of other living beings.

November 11 - This session explores the universal need for beauty and cultivates children's appreciation of nature's beauty. Activities draw from the UU Source, "Direct experience of that transcending mystery and wonder, affirmed in all cultures, which moves us to a renewal of the spirit and an openness to the forces that create and uphold life."

November 18-We will learn that we get much of our energy from burning nonrenewable fuels—coal, petroleum or oil, or natural gas. But green energy comes from sources that are cleaner and less-polluting than most nonrenewable fuels.
