
# **Where Does Your Money Go?**

The majority of All Faiths' proposed expenditures are for staff, including salaries, benefits, worker's compensation, and payroll fees (\$182,662) and building expenses which include the mortgage, utilities, and insurance (\$34,280). Besides these essential items, your generosity supports the day-to-day operations of the Congregation.

### **We've Faced Many Challenges This Year**:

- COVID-19 meant no in-house services, but...
  we adapted and learned how to livestream
- We lost our usual rental income, but... we will be renting our lawn to a Farmer's market for the winter
  - Canceled fundraisers meant less income, but...
    we are planning online fundraisers
- Lost pledges for various reasons, but...
  we qualified for the Paycheck Protection Program Loan which covered our payroll for two months
  - No services meant no plate donations, but ... many Congregants sent donations above and beyond their pledges
- Expenses have arisen, such as the deck having to be replaced, but...
  we have capital and operating reserves to draw on

# **And Have Many Blessings to Count**

- Minister who provides meaningful Sunday services, as well as loving pastoral care
- Staff with excellent skills and willingness to "go the extra mile" to keep things running smoothly
  - Expanding/thriving Youth Religious Education program: attendance has grown from four youth to as many as 12!
    - Great music continues to inspire our services
- Active Justice Ministries on several fronts, including a bigger than ever Lee Interfaith for Empowerment (LIFE) network
- Social Action Teams building just, equitable & compassionate community
  - Many volunteers doing the work of the congregation
- Mortgage is under \$94,000; if Burn-the-Mortgage donations continue, it will be paid off before the 2024 balloon payment due date
