

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BOARD NOTES by Chris Stotler, Board Chair

The Board of Directors meeting was held on September 16, 2020 at 1:00 p.m. via Zoom teleconference.

Your Board of Directors, as well as most of you, are tired of COVID restrictions that we must live under to protect our own health and the health of others. We reviewed the Florida and Lee County COVID data to determine whether we can change our status from a modified Phase 1 of our Reopening Plan. Although the data are looking better, they are not good enough to safely move to Phase 2. Because the COVID data are improving, we will review the situation again in early October rather than waiting until the board meeting which is scheduled later in October. The Board is continuing to look at options to improve livestreamed and recorded services.

The great job done by all the speakers during the time Rev. CJ was on vacation and in study is greatly appreciated. We are fortunate to have so many capable people to step forward whenever Rev. CJ is not in the pulpit.

The plant sale that Judy Alberda organized was successful, raising \$261. As of this writing, there are still potted plants available. Just leave a donation on the porch for plants you take. Judy still needs volunteers to help with weeding and other garden work. If you can help, show up early on Monday or Thursday mornings or give Judy a call.

The Board acted on recommendations of the Finance Committee to change some line items in the budget. Because we are not having in-person services, some expenses are lower than planned while others are higher or were not anticipated. These changes do not affect the total budget approved by the Congregation. One of the new costs is the \$600

fee charged by the IRS to process our application for a letter stating that we are a non-profit meeting 501(c)3 requirements. We have not needed this letter in the past because we meet the IRS requirements to be categorized as a nonprofit by being a religious organization. However, recently some companies and organizations are requiring an actual letter from the IRS. Therefore, we will develop the application in October.

As reported last month, our deck is in serious need of major repair. The Board approved moving forward with repairing or replacing the deck. We will not know the actual costs until the existing flooring is removed so the condition of the support beams can be assessed. Approval was granted to spend up to \$3,500 for materials and disposal costs; however, it is anticipated that the actual cost will be considerably less. The construction will be completed using volunteer help. We are requesting "wish list" donations to cover part or all of the expense. The costs not covered by donations will come from the Capital Fund. If you wish to make a donation towards the deck repair costs, please send a check to All Faiths with a notation that it is for the deck repair. Call me if you can help with the repairs.

We approved purchasing a new over-the-ear microphone and transmitter. Three members/couples stepped forward and offered to pay the \$500 costs, thus preventing an extra strain to our budget. Thank you for the special donations.

The Board started discussions about creating a Director of Youth Religious Education (DYRE) staff position. There is no question about the need for this part-time position and its benefits. Most younger people seeking a church home

The Finance Committee will evaluate a proposal from Rev. CJ regarding the position and advise the Board by its October meeting.

The annual financial review was completed by Ernie Reid, Ed Kleinow, and John Conrad; they had lots of help from Regina, who pulled together the documents they requested. The reviewers did not find any problems with the procedures being followed. They did recommend some changes to policy or procedures that are being reviewed by the Finance Committee. We greatly appreciate the time and thought that went into their review.



climate change movement in our area. Our online meetings have included presentations by:

Dr. Ana Puszkin-Chevlin, regional director of Growing Climate Solutions Path to Positive Southwest Florida, an organization dedicated to empowering community members and leaders to initiate change, ensure a prosperous and healthy community and build climate literacy and resilience. Revenue/Operating Income declined in August, compared to July. This will hopefully improve over the coming months as many of our congregants return to southwest Florida. The generosity of our congregants is very much appreciated especially during these times of being unable to attend All Faiths in person.

Most of our expenses have remained lower than budgeted because of the fiscal restraints that the Board approved at earlier Board meetings. The \$5,000 gift to the UUA, that was budgeted, was sent to the UUA in August.

The Burn the Mortgage program continues with donations of \$5,250.00 received in August. The outstanding mortgage principal at the end of August was \$99,738.70. This is significant progress because on April 1, 2019 (less than 1.5 years ago) the mortgage principal balance was \$151,234.48!!

The Small Business Administration PPP loan was approved on May 1, 2020; and the \$27,300 loan was deposited on May 5. We anticipate that the loan will be forgiven and treated as a grant by the SBA once proper documentation is submitted. Susan Anthony of the Finance Committee is taking the lead on the necessary paperwork to help ensure that the documentation is sufficient and completed on a timely basis.

In August, \$645 was collected for Operation Joy (Back to School).

OCTOBER'S SERVICE THEME IS LGBTQ+ - BE IN THE KNOW

Many Americans refrain from talking about sexual orientation and gender identity or expression because it feels taboo, or because they're afraid of saying the wrong thing. This glossary was written to help give people the words and meanings to help make conversations easier and more comfortable.

Ally | A person who is not LGBTQ but shows support for LGBTQ people and promotes equality in a variety of ways.

Androgynous | Identifying and/or presenting as neither distinguishably masculine nor feminine.

Asexual | The lack of a sexual attraction or desire for other people.

Biphobia | Prejudice, fear or hatred directed toward bisexual people.

Bisexual | A person emotionally, romantically or sexually attracted to more than one sex, gender or gender identity though not necessarily simultaneously, in the same way or to the same degree.

Cisgender | A term used to describe a person whose gender identity aligns with those typically associated with the sex assigned to them at birth.

Closeted | Describes an LGBTQ person who has not disclosed their sexual orientation or gender identity.

Coming out | The process in which a person first acknowledges, accepts and appreciates their sexual orientation or gender identity and begins to share that with others.

Gay | A person who is emotionally, romantically or sexually attracted to members of the same gender.

Gender dysphoria | Clinically significant distress caused when a person's assigned birth gender is not the same as the one with which they identify. According to the American Psychiatric Diagnostic Association's and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (DSM), the term - which replaces Gender Identity Disorder -"is intended to better characterize the experiences of affected children, adolescents, and adults."

Gender-expansive | Conveys a wider, more flexible range of gender identity and/or expression than typically associated with the binary gender system.

Gender expression | External appearance of one's gender identity, usually expressed through behavior, clothing, haircut or voice, and which may or may not conform to socially defined behaviors and characteristics typically associated with being either masculine or feminine.

Gender-fluid | According to the Oxford English Dictionary, a person who does not identify with a single fixed gender; of or relating to a person having or expressing a fluid or unfixed gender identity.

Gender identity | One's innermost concept of self as male, female, a blend of both or neither – how individuals perceive themselves and what they call themselves. One's gender identity can be the same or different from their sex assigned at birth.

Gender non-conforming | A broad term referring to people who do not behave in a way that conforms to the traditional expectations of their gender, or whose gender expression does not fit neatly into a category.

Genderqueer | Genderqueer people typically reject notions of static categories of gender and embrace a fluidity of gender identity and often, though not always, sexual orientation. People who identify as "genderqueer" may see themselves as being both male and female, neither male nor female or as falling completely outside these categories.

Gender transition | The process by which some people strive to more closely align their internal knowledge of gender with its outward appearance. Some people socially transition,

whereby they might begin dressing, using names and pronouns and/or be socially recognized as another gender. Others undergo physical transitions in which they modify their bodies through medical interventions.

Homophobia | The fear and hatred of or discomfort with people who are attracted to members of the same sex.

Intersex | An umbrella term used to describe a wide range of natural bodily variations. In some cases, these traits are visible at birth, and in others, they are not apparent until puberty. Some chromosomal variations of this type may not be physically apparent at all.

Lesbian | A woman who is emotionally, romantically or sexually attracted to other women.

LGBTQ | An acronym for "lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer."

Living openly | A state in which LGBTQ people are comfortably out about their sexual orientation or gender identity – where and when it feels appropriate to them.

Non-binary | An adjective describing a person who does not identify exclusively as a man or a woman. Non-binary people may identify as being both a man and a woman, somewhere in between, or as falling com-

pletely outside these categories. While many also identify as transgender, not all non-binary people do.

Outing | Exposing someone's lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender identity to others without their permission. Outing someone can have serious repercussions on employment, economic stability, personal safety or religious or family situations.

Pansexual | Describes someone who has the potential for emotional, romantic or sexual attraction to people of any gender though not necessarily simultaneously, in the same way or to the same degree.

Queer | A term people often use to express fluid identities and orientations. Often used interchangeably with "LG-BTQ."

Questioning | A term used to describe people who are in the process of exploring their sexual orientation or gender identity.

Same-gender loving | A term some prefer to use instead of lesbian, gay or bisexual to express attraction to and love of people of the same gender.

Sex assigned at birth | The sex (male or female) given to a child at birth, most often based on the child's external anatomy. This is also referred to as "assigned sex at birth."

Sexual orientation | An inherent or immutable enduring emotional, romantic or sexual attraction to other people.

Transgender | An umbrella term for people whose gender identity and/or expression is different from cultural expectations based on the sex they were assigned at birth. Being transgender does not imply any specific sexual orientation. Therefore, transgender people may identify as straight, gay, lesbian, bisexual, etc.

Transphobia | The fear and hatred of, or discomfort with, transgender people.

YOUTH RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Based on feedback and questions I have recently received, perhaps a brief background of Youth Religious Education (YRE) at All Faiths may be helpful. While I am aware that a robust YRE existed on and off prior to my becoming a member, because I have no personal knowledge of it, I will speak to my experiences by referencing the minister's term.

Rev. Wayne Robinson – I taught YRE on the porch outside during service. I created lessons and materials based on the service's topic for the week/world religion holidays/current events. Weekly attendance varied greatly; the weather was often oppressive; and noise distracted some members. It was discontinued due to lack of attendance.

Rev. Margaret Beard – no YRE

Rev. C.J. McGregor – First two years

YRE was held in the Robinson Room during service. I coordinated lessons and teachers and taught two or three Sundays a month. (Thank you to Dawna Lieber, Sheila Donovan, and Rosalie Kuehn for all of your help and support!). All lessons were taken from the Tapestry of Faith UU curriculum (Check it out: https://www.uua.org/re/tapestry/children). Each curriculum includes comprehensive plans and detailed instructions. Information was shared regarding what the youth were learning via All Faiths' newsletter, *Connections*. As youth gained background knowledge and developed close relationships with each other, they began to take ownership and direction of what they wanted to explore.

Since COVID

From March through mid-July, I taught YRE via Zoom every Sunday afternoon. Lessons were based on current events and/or youth-generated topics. We followed a fluid plan, meaning that it could be changed upon group agreement. The template for our agenda included and continues to include: Lighting of our Chalice, Mindfulness Exercise, Joys & Concerns, and more.

September 2020

We are trying new things! Our Sunday afternoon meetings often extended over two hours, indicating to me that the youth needed more time for connection. Therefore, we are now meeting twice a week.

Sunday 10:30 – 11:30 a.m. In order to feel more connected to the congregation, YRE will meet during service via Zoom. I will be physically present at the church with the youth on Zoom. We will move to the Robinson Room after Joseph (and you at home) sing us out. Our lessons will align with the sermon's theme so that families (and the congregation in the future) can converse about a common topic.

Wednesday 7:00 - 8:30 p.m. This is an informal Zoom meeting I facilitate from my home (for now). There is a theme agreed upon by the youth the prior week and discussion is youth directed. The purpose of this meeting is building community and fellowship within a UU environment.

In other words, on Sundays we will explore principles and aspects of what it means to be UU. On Wednesdays, we will be growing and journeying in relationship within a safe, loving, accepting space.


